Implement pharmacist-driven warfarin management.				
Use alerts to avoid multiple prescriptions of opioids/sedatives.				
Use effective tools to reduce over-sedation from opioids (e.g. risk assessment tools, sedation assessment tools).				
Reduce sliding scale variation (or eliminate sliding scales).				
Minimize or eliminate pharmacist or nurse distraction during the medication fulfillment/administration process.				
Use data/information from alerts and overrides to redesign standardized processes.				
Coordinate meal and insulin times.
